Cet atelier permet aux jeunes musiciens de (re)découvrir le plaisir de jouer ensemble. Les groupes sont composés des grandes familles d'instruments, guitare, basse, batterie, clavier, chant...
- **Section musicale adaptée : Éveil musical et cours de piano**
Réservée aux enfants à partir de 4 ans, aux adolescents ainsi qu'aux adultes rencontrant des troubles de l'apprentissage (- dys -), des troubles de comportement (TOC, hyperactivité...etc) et/ou étant en situation de handicap (moteur, sensoriel, mental).
Une véritable rencontre musicale dans un espace rassurant, réalisée avec une pédagogie individualisée et spécialisée.

Minutes of the Annual General Meeting 2021, Part I

Online video conference via Zoom on May 28, 2021 at 2:30 pm



Bernadette Ulens, President, opens the meeting:

Welcome to all of you! Thank you for participating - in such large numbers in this first online Annual General Meeting - despite this sun which has been so lacking... We have 126 participants and 40 proxies! Let me first point out that this session will be recorded. Then, some of us will speak in French and others in English. Obviously we will miss the Commission's interpreters and we ask for your understanding.

This is, of course, a first for us! This virtual AGM (Annual General Meeting) was organised by the Executive Board on the basis of the Law of December 20, 2020, which made temporary and structural provisions for the fight against the spread of Covid 19. The CA (Administrative Council) had previously granted permission to members to participate in the AGM remotely and therefore to vote remotely.

The agenda and all the documentation concerning the items on the agenda were sent by *Infoletter* to the members of the Association; those who do not have access to the internet were informed by their group leaders.

As you already know, the items on the agenda, i.e. mainly the financial accounts and the discharge of the Board of Directors, must by law be dealt with by the Annual General Meeting **before June 30, 2021**.

The other issues related to the statutes and the election of the new EB (Executive Board) will be the subject of the second part of the AGM, scheduled to take place in person on September 27.

Niovi Kyriazakou, Secretary General, took the floor to appoint the secretaries of the meeting: Małgorzata Lukomska for the French version and Marian Conneely for the English version.

The agenda of the AGM 2021 Part I is approved.



Report of the President and the Executive Board:

Bernadette Ulens:

The year 2020 will remain a memorable year for the Femmes d'Europe. And not only as the year of the pandemic! In 2020 we found ourselves at a crossroads. The choices were on the one hand, to bow our heads and "temporarily" stop our activities. The temptation was there, because we wanted to give priority to our families and also because many of us had returned to their country of origin.

The other alternative was not to give up, to continue to function as best we could. By choosing not to give up, we chose life! The life of our Association, which will emerge stronger. We have also learned, almost all of us, to handle the electronic resources that are at our disposal. We have become accustomed to virtual CAs and Project Committees - and some people even tell us that they find these meetings more efficient!

Our Vice President for Projects is invited to tell us about the emotions and feelings of the Project Committee during the past months, when the virus did not give us any respite.

Eva Töttösy-Tackoen, Vice-President Projects reports :

Throughout the months of this year 2020, the Femmes d'Europe Projects have gone through a panoply of strong emotions.

At the end of January at the Projects Ceremony: *Euphoria!* A full house at the Berlaymont, interesting speakers, an exceptional year celebrated by a convivial party of Fd'E members and a multitude of Associations and friends.

February: Joyful satisfaction: 24 promising national projects (NAT) submitted at €7000. The Brochure was being prepared.

March : *Worrying* about the unknown. The Coronavirus (lockdown) confines us. The NAT presentation is cancelled. A phone book type Question and Answer Brochure is sent to the whole CA (Administrative Council). Momentary relief: The 24 national projects are voted on, approved, and soon funded as well as 4 RAPs (Rapid Aid Projects)

April: *Catastrophe and waiting:* 17 PED (developing countries projects) are under consideration: the fund is almost empty and there is no hope of holding future events. First Zoom CA. Not even one project is submitted for voting!

May-June : *Timid rebound :* 4 PED and 1 RAP on health subjects are voted. Freeze on all future projects following the revised budget.

July-August-September: *Lethargy and desolation:* 1 PED can be voted at the September Administrative Council meeting.

October: *Slight hope:* The scattered Projects Committee rallies effectively. Decision to try to finance all the PEDs submitted as and when they come in. Thanks to the virtual Bazaars, 3 PEDs and 1 RAP can be financed.

November : *Audacity :* Another 3 PEDs and 2 RAPSs are voted on.

December finally: *Overflowing joy. Victory!*

A last PED, 2 RAPs and 5 Christmas Gifts allow us to close the year with 52 projects for an amount of almost €240.000. Of course, many of the 2020 projects concern health: medical and sanitary equipment, especially for handicapped or fragile people, but also school equipment, IT material to allow active lock-down and social distancing in virtual proximity for young people or seniors. Renovation of unhealthy premises or shelters for street (homeless) youth and for the homeless, solar panels, wells for water, tools to create sources of income, which also constitute an improvement in the lives of so many disadvantaged people, also featured among the projects.

Eva thanks the **Projects Committee** who have spared no effort this exceptional year to complete the examination of the projects submitted: Monique Boissonnas, Angela Carisi, Sabine Cartuyvels, Silvia Gusmao Schmidt, Gaby Lautenberg, Danielle Llewellyn, Maeve Schiratti-Doran, Tina Katila and Malgorzata Lukomska. Eva announced two new co-workers on the Projects Committee - Vicky Argyraki and Renate Kubat-Smith.

Then the floor is given to Ghislaine Troubetzkoy to talk about this difficult year, she who always knew that we are all creative and smart, so she too kept the faith! Our Virtual Bazaar was more successful than ever.

Together we have shown resilience, the ability to bounce back and exceptional creativity to avoid the financial abyss into which our Association could have plunged. Had we not not all questioned our habits and gone out of our comfort zones? Think of reading the Newsletter solely via the website! Think of our use of Zoom!

If we had all crossed our arms and said to ourselves, "there is nothing we can do! it's too dangerous! I don't understand anything! it's the same for everyone! too bad... ?"

If all of us had not made our family and friends aware of the problems and had not made donations or purchases at the Christmas Bazaar, the Association Femmes d'Europe would not have raised the funds to support 52 projects. So, it is with great emotion that I send you my heartfelt thanks.



Isabella Quattrocchi, Vice President Press and Communication reports:

I'd like to ask you all to remember Nina Paaskesen, who is not well. With regard to communication I can say that 2020 was a very special year. Our Association has learned to become "virtual" and thanks to our website, our members have been able to organise events in a different way. A Zoom account was created to allow for Zoom events and Group meetings.

The most visited parts of the website are: Members Space, Newsletter (NL), Events, and Projects; there have been 200,847 visits to the site so far. We have been able to produce our Newsletter; every month the members have read it through our website. The internal communication has been maintained by means of *Infoletters* sent directly to all members. We have kept in touch through our President's regular letters and through our "Don't miss in the coming months!" messages.

What can we expect in the future? We do not know, but one thing is sure, we have been able to keep in touch during these difficult months and we know that we, the Femmes d'Europe, can face all the challenges and find solutions to the most serious problems. I want to make a call to all members - ***we are looking for volunteers for the Newsletter.*** Please do not hesitate to contact me if you are willing to help.

A big thank you to Karen Englander who took over the work in the last two months and made the publication of our Newsletter possible.

Niovi Kyriazakou, Secretary General reports:

Welcome to the 2021 Annual General Meeting - 1st part online- a first for our Association! 2020 was a year like no other!

A microscopic virus has completely changed our lives - the way we work, travel, communicate, greet...We are delighted that our Association has been able to continue to live, adapt and operate in this particularly difficult context where the pandemic has revealed and amplified the fragility of our world. All this is thanks to you, to our solidarity which unites us and has made us stronger than ever.

From the very beginning of this crisis we managed to "Keep in touch". In this past year, **thanks to your engagement, creativity, continuous support and generosity**, we managed to organize our monthly CA meetings, a virtual Christmas Bazaar, Zoom conferences and several other events online thus raising money that enabled us to finance more than 50 wonderful projects, primarily in Europe but also all over the world.

Today, we are hosting our Annual General Meeting (1st part) online and we hope that we will be able to hold a physical meeting in the Charlemagne for the **2nd part** (scheduled for **Monday 27th of September**). We are, however, also already working on a **Plan B**.

Last Friday we turned the key in the door of our office in Beaulieu for the last time - after 28 years! What good memories we will keep of these premises! They will certainly encourage us to continue our journey elsewhere.

Vice-Treasurer report:**



A year ago I drafted a speech for the presentation of the 2019 balance sheet. It would be the first time for me to present the numbers at an AGM in my capacity of treasurer. Fate decided otherwise and my talk ended up in the bin!

Actually that was the least of our worries during the past, rather unusual, pandemic year of 2020. I remember we were starting well: our financial objective was a tough one,

as we like to match the previous year in our results and 2019 had been a very good year.

And then it happened. "Pack your bags! Stay at home!" Office closed. Luckily, I could work with an app from our bank, ING, and follow every payment and expense, pay any project or invoice. Admin from home, my private "BOB bulle" (Covid bubble). And no (physically present) events or meetings.

But, my friends, we were creative and resourceful and we managed, no, in fact we did really well!

The cancelled Easter Bazaar was replaced by very successful "Dons de Printemps". Events were replaced by a number of Zooms, walks, a virtual Bazaar, we even sneaked in an event in the window of freedom given after the summer, and, last but not least, a very successful virtual Christmas Bazaar and "Dons de Noël" campaign. And so, I'm happy, and lost in admiration of you all, I can present the 2020 results of our Femmes d'Europe activities of which we can all be proud!

I will be brief. Over 2020 we had a total turnover of 253.000 euros, this includes membership fees, proceeds from events and donations. We had budgeted for 320.000 euro. Obviously the proceeds from events were far lower than expected but donations were far above expectations by the end of the year, partly compensating for the fall in receipts.

Our expenses for events declined accordingly, as did those for the Members Directory and Newsletters, that could no longer be published on paper, thus eliminating postage costs.

Our administrative costs were limited to 5.300 euro, the office was closed but some insurance, telephone, internet, IT expenses remained payable.

Which leads me to our largest expense: the reason we exist, **our projects**. When Covid 19 hit the world, we were obliged to pay the 2020 NATs for which we had already set an amount, a year earlier, of 7.000 euro per NAT. This led to a total expense of 160.400 euro. And we had paid about 10.000 euro in RAPs before Covid affected us.

We set out to revise a budget whereby we limited our maximum loss for the year and estimated what we could still earn under these unusual circumstances, thereby determining the room for further RAPs and PEDs. Eva and her team had to be very flexible as to when the funds were available and disappoint quite a number of Associations. Whilst carefully monitoring our in- and outflow we paid out a total of 57.000 euro in PEDs and another 10.000 euro in RAPs.

By year-end we were allowing for a final result of minus 100.000 euro max, based on uncertain results of a virtual

Christmas Bazaar and a "Dons de Noël" campaign. And then our expectations on the income side were more than surpassed. A Bazaar that yielded **63.000 euro** and "Dons de Noël" of over **60.000 euro**.

In all, this has led to a positive result for the year 2020 of 2.500 euro, whilst we had originally budgeted a loss of 42.500 euro. However, we must remain realistic; this result comes from both being very inventive in finding a means to generate funds but also unfortunately from a considerable reduction in the number of projects we financed.

Instead of the 344.000 euro budgeted for 2020 we financed projects for 239.000 euro.

Bernadette Grünhage and I, backed by the BE, wanted to be cautious, as we do not know how long Covid is going to affect our activities, and we believe a second year might perhaps not evidence the same generosity we saw last year. We aimed to protect our capital, allowing us to continue our work as long as possible in a worst-case situation.

Provisional Budget for 2021

By year end 2020 our capital stood at 313.000 euro, and we have budgeted to spend at least 200.000 euro on projects in 2021. As we expect Fd'E to generate revenues of 185.000 euro and to limit our overheads to just under 12.000 euro, we predict a result of around 27.000 euro loss in 2021.

Once the world around us settles again, our aim should be to return to funding projects at the levels we were used to, using our capital to cover the eventual shortfall between our revenues and our project expenses, leaving a healthy minimum buffer for future unforeseen circumstances. I would now like to answer any questions you might have.

Liesbeth extends her warm thanks to Bernadette G. for her valuable and hard work for all these years. Bernadette G. assures us that it has been a pleasure and an honour to do the treasury work for the Association.

Our treasurer pointed out that these accounts had been drawn up in a spirit of sincerity, good faith and transparency.

The procedure for voting is by a show of hands: Isabella Quattrocchi, Vice-President Press and Communication, took screenshots of all the participants, who voted by a show of hands (Yes, No or Blank). The Executive Board having

collected all the proxies beforehand, they will be taken into account.

NB: Bernadette Ulens, Niovi Kyriazakou and Liesbeth Knulst, who formed the "Organising Committee", will not vote.

Registered at the AGM: **126-** **Voters: 97---** Result of the votes:

--Provisional budget 2021, Discharge to the Board of Directors, Membership fee for 2022: all three voted unanimously (and approved).

--Annual accounts for 2020: 96 YES, 1 blank vote.

Annual membership fee for 2022:

After a brief discussion, it was concluded that, although the amount had remained unchanged for several years, given that members' incomes may have fallen in 2020, it was not appropriate to increase the membership fee. We are happy to receive a donation in addition to the membership fee if our members wish to do so. The amount is maintained at **50 €**.

Closing of the Annual General Meeting 2021 -first part by the President B.U.

(The second part will take place in September)

Thank you to the Executive Board, the Administrative Council and the General Assembly, thank you for your energy and courage! We can be proud of what we have achieved in 2020!

We also fully appreciate how important our families and our friendship are. The vaccinations give us hope to enjoy the holidays in 2021 and soon we hope to meet again in our new offices in Joseph II!

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Young Mum - Vienna, Austria

Young Mum in Vienna is a unique organisation. Its mission is to accompany very young mothers – under 20 years of age - during pregnancy, birth and the first years of their babies' lives.

Young Mum was founded by Mrs Uschi Reim-Hofer, a midwife at the 'Göttlicher Heiland' hospital. She saw that many very young pregnant women need to be encouraged to have their baby, to receive the special attention they require and to be taught all the skills necessary for motherhood.

A significant number of young women have difficulties with their parents to the point of being expelled from home. They may also come from precarious situations or broken homes and have not learned the essentials to look after themselves, much less a new-born baby. Mrs Reim-Hofer recognised the needs of these young women and persuaded the hospital to let her use some rooms for a safe place to accompany these very young mothers-to-be. So 'Haus Lena' was created.

Over the past 19 years she and her team of nurses, midwives, social workers and psychologists have accompanied more than 1200 young women throughout their pregnancies.

The women receive all necessary medical care, learn about legal implications, and attend pre-natal and post-natal gym classes. They also receive psychological care, have baby-care lessons, and acquire cooking skills for themselves and their babies during the first year after birth. Where appropriate, contact will also be sought with the parents of the mother, to provide advice on how to continue with their daughter's own schooling or education.

The average number of mothers who deliver their babies in the care of **Young Mum** is around 80-100 per year.

Another important aspect of the centre is the opportunity to build supportive networks with other mothers in similar situations and to form friendships.

Public education is a further part of their work. The centre's midwives visit schools and deliver education on sexuality, contraception, pregnancy, and childcare. This activity serves as a publicity tool to make **Young Mum** more widely known. This service is very popular with secondary schools in and around Vienna and is always booked up a long time in advance.



The **Young Mum** centre has received the 'Health Award' of the City of Vienna for its achievements. Although their services and

their premises are provided free of charge, the centre cannot cover all its costs and is continually in search of financial help and donations. When they addressed our Association, they were about to move to a different hospital, as the Maternity Department of 'Göttlicher Heiland' Hospital had to be closed due to re-organisation. Their new 'home' is now the St. Josef Hospital in Vienna, which has a big, specialised Maternity Unit. Funds for the furnishing of the new premises had to be found.

Association Femmes d'Europe intervened, designating this to be an Austrian National project for 2020.


The money was used for:

- a new kitchen – to teach teenage mothers how to cook for their babies and for themselves
- 16 new chairs for the waiting room and the big meeting room – where they organise workshops for the teenage mothers but also hold staff meetings.
- 5 new office chairs for the staff

The centre put the kitchen and furniture into use immediately after installation and continues to support the young mothers - with renewed energy - in clean, modern rooms.

Everyone knows the paintings with merry companies in which there is dancing, music making, wine drinking and flirtation. This genre was extremely popular in the seventeenth century. But is this just about entertainment or is there more to it? What does the fool do in the midst of the party and why are these young people dressed so showy? The popular emblem books are an important source for the interpretation. These are picture books in which a certain concept is explained on the basis of an image. Apparently everyday situations and objects are given a symbolic explanation. It is not surprising that this explanation is moralizing. The underlying message is: having fun is allowed, but beware of the dangers. Especially the young suitors and their loved ones have to be careful! Humour goes hand in hand with morality, learning and entertainment. This lecture is about the slippery path of love, marriage (watch out for women wearing the pants), the unequal couple and old age.

Thera Folmer is an art historian and gives lectures and courses about art. She has been working as curator of the Liberna Collection, a private collection of old books, prints and drawings.

Bringing Magic Back to the Planet with Trees

The tree — the link between heaven and earth

*"You wipe out the forests yet they embellish the earth,
teaching mankind to understand what is beautiful and inspiring
feelings of awe.
Forests temper the harshness of the climates."*



These words come from Anton Chekhov's play "The Wood Demon" spoken in the late 19th century by the main character, Michael Khrushchev, a doctor and philanthropist. 'Planting trees' is seen as a humanist project contributing to his quest for freedom, hope and happiness.

Chekhov was interested in ecological issues from very early on, especially in the deforestation of Russia at that time. For him a single tree could represent the forest. Trees are very present in his plays: 'The Steppe', 'Uncle Vanya', 'The Three Sisters', 'The Cherry Orchard'...

This can probably be explained by his enthusiasm for Leon Tolstoy and the theories of Charles Darwin first published in 1859.



Anton Chekhov was almost certainly one of the first 'ecologists'. In fact, the term 'ecology' was used for the first time in a scientific paper by the German biologist Ernst Haeckel in 1866. The latter was also an advocate of Darwin's theories.

Today the issue of preserving trees for a greener and more beautiful planet is very relevant.

This article looks at the historical relationship between Man and Tree before moving on to those forests in countries where 'Planting Trees means a Happy Life and Peace'.

Diverse civilizations have always maintained a special relationship with trees. Depending on the culture, a variety of beliefs are held: the sacred tree, the tree of life, tree of healing, wishing trees, the tree of freedom, the Bodhi tree...

I am particularly fond of the Bodhi tree or Tree of Enlightenment because it is an enchanting tree. This tree, also known as the sacred fig - the *ficus religiosa* – has heart-shaped leaves that are thought to bring good luck and a variety of medicinal properties. One of its distinctive features is its ability to transform carbon dioxide into oxygen during both day and night. It also has medicinal properties.

It was under this very tree, the *pippala* tree, that Siddhartha Gautama, the founder of Buddhism, attained enlightenment. And so, thanks to this tree he became Buddha, literally the 'enlightened one', and found happiness.

So, can we experience wonder without trees? The tree is like an observer - a witness to both humankind and the environment. Artists have always understood this and have long integrated trees and their symbolic meaning into their art, even into very contemporary works.

For example, in one of the 31 sculptures in 'Dialogue with Emperor Qin – China – EU', the Finnish artist Antero Toikka depicts his peace warrior as just a red tree trunk, man and tree being one.

Another example is the 2009 exhibition of Félix Roulin's urban forest: ten magnificent columns, stately and impressive, stand upright like trees. They contain both beauty and clarity in their expression. The connection between heaven and earth expresses man's duality, the spiritual and the material. They are like tree trunks placed in an urban setting of diverse buildings. Visible in glimpses, youthful female bodies inhabit the ten columns showing these to be sculptures about desire and fertility: trees — full of sap and life.

For these artists, trees and mankind are symbolically connected to life. Going beyond the emotional and spiritual ties that make trees so essential to man, the protection of forests is also of economic and ecological importance. It is an existential necessity for humankind.

The problem of deforestation is a global one. In terms of the sheer volume of wood, throughout the world between 2000 and 2010, more than 100 million cubic metres of wood were felled illegally every year. This is enough to go around the planet ten times, that is roughly 400 000 kilometres – the circumference of the planet around the equator being about 40 075 km.

Current deforestation mainly concerns the rainforests as half of the planet's forests were destroyed during the 20th century. Today, 13 million hectares of forest vanish every year. This is better than in the 1990s (16 million hectares) but is still too much. This has either happened due to natural causes or else due to man converting areas into agricultural land.

Protection schemes and reforestation have however been developed in some countries.

In 1920 according to the US Forest Service, the **United States** had 292 million hectares of forest. By 2016, this area had grown to over 304 million hectares, so there has been a slight increase over the past century and forest now covers about a third of the country. Most of these forests are found in the west of the country, to which can be added the boreal forests of Alaska and the pine plantations in the south. The situation remains fragile and is threatened by the increase in forest fires.

In **Brazil**, deforestation is a trend that has gathered momentum since the 1970s, and continues with the arrival of a populist government. For about twenty years, the debate on climate change has focussed the attention of the whole world on the situation of

the Amazon rainforest, which is considered to be a carbon sink indispensable to humankind with the issues at stake extending well beyond the Brazilian border.


The **Congo Basin rainforest** in Central Africa is the second largest rainforest after the Amazon rainforest. It covers almost three million square kilometres, that is 300 million hectares and spreads across six countries: the Cameroon, the Central African Republic, the Republic of Congo, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Gabon and Equatorial Guinea. With an annual loss of 0.3% during the 2000s, the region has the lowest deforestation rate of all major forest areas.

In **China**, despite several woodland preservation programmes and nature reserves, implemented to prevent soil erosion and the spread of the desert, forests cover less than 20 % of China's landmass, in comparison to the global average of 30 %. This is therefore relatively little.

However, since 2018, reforestation has started again. During the last five years, woodlands have increased by over 208 million hectares, which nonetheless represents only a slight increase of about 0.1 % of the wooded surface area.

India used to be almost entirely covered with forest, but the total forest area was reduced fourfold down to only 20 %. Special efforts have been made since the 2000s and the forest cover had risen to 25 % in 2020.

At the Paris conference on climate change, India committed to increasing forest cover to 33 % by the year 2030.



The **European Union's** forests cover over 158 million hectares (5 % of the global forest surface area). This is 37.7 % of the surface of the EU. Six

countries, Sweden, Finland, Spain, France, Germany and Poland account for two thirds of the EU's forests.

On a national level, forest cover varies greatly: Finland, Sweden and Slovenia have almost 60% forest cover, whereas the Netherlands has only 8.9%. Unlike many parts of the world where deforestation remains a major problem, the EU's forests are growing: they gained around 11 million hectares between 1990 and 2010, mainly as a result of natural growth and reforestation initiatives.

Finally, **Russia's** forests represent a fifth of all the world's forests combined, making it the largest forest in the world with 809 million hectares, even bigger than Brazil's 520 million hectares. It covers 70% of the territory. Yet even the Russian Federation is not spared from deforestation.

Despite this, it may well be Russia who provides the solution to global deforestation, notably through its long history of experience in multi-sourced and multi-resourced forest inventories that take into

account all the forests' resources and their social and ecological functions. Moreover, the vast surface area of Russia's forests, their expanse and condition have considerable importance for the rest of the world. Russia's experience of forestry and forest management could be of interest to many other countries.

If we want to continue to inhabit this planet and be amazed by its wonders, we need to maintain the beauty of our forests.

For each one of us and for every country, it is not too late to fully commit to preserving our trees. This is also our duty to future generations.

Of course, responsible international cooperation concerning these problems affecting our planet is more than necessary. We must accept interdependence and go into action: planting trees and educating the young and not-so-young on the subject of trees and forests.

It's so important to give love and protection to our trees.
